Do you travel for work?	Yes, I travel a lot for work.
Present simple – “usually”	
Where are you going for your next trip?	Tomorrow, I am travelling to Paris.
Present continuous – future arrangement	
When did you last go to Spain?	Last week I went to Madrid.
Past simple – finished event	
How many times have you been to Spain?	I have been to Madrid 5 times. I have never seen any other cities in Spain.
Present perfect – so far in my life	
How long did you stay in Madrid last time you went?	I was there for 3 days.
Past simple – finished event	
	I normally stay for a week.
Present simple – “Usually”	
When do you think you will next go to Belgium?	I imagine it will be next year, now.
Future simple - forecast	
Where would you like to travel to next?	I would like to go to Mexico.
Conditional	
Do you like Latin America?	Yes, I do, very much.
Present simple – taste/ opinion	
Can you speak Spanish?	No I can't.
Present simple – ability “Can”	
	But next year I am going to learn.
Going to do – intention for the future	
Which languages can you speak?	I can speak English and Italian.
Present simple – ability “Can”	
	Now, I am learning French as well.
Present continuous – around the time of speaking	
How long have you been learning French?	I have been learning French for about 6 months.
Present perfect continuous – period till the present for a “continuous” activity	
Where are you studying?	I started to go to one college but I didn't like it.
Past simple – finished , no longer	
	So, now I am going to another college.
Present continuous – around the time of speaking	
Do you think you will stay at this college?	Yes, I will.
Future simple - forecast	
What do you do?	I am an engineer. I work for ABC Ltd
Present simple – regular / daily	
Really, how long have you worked there?	I have worked there for 10 years now.
Present perfect – so far.	
Where did you work before ABC Ltd?	I was at University.
Past simple – finished events.	
What is ABC Ltd going to do about their financial troubles?	ABC is going to restructure its European operations.
Going to do – intention to do something	
Would you like something to drink?	Yes, I would. I would love a coffee.
